Need a vaccine?

The Virginia Department of Health has now opened eligibility for vaccines to phase 2, which means employees and students are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. **To attend an on-campus clinic the week of April 19, [sign up here](#).**

You will receive an email from “Vaccination Clinics” (no-reply@multistatep4p.com) with a subject line “COVID-19 Registration Invitation” when it is time to schedule your appointment.

It is important that you check your email regularly to look for opportunities to schedule an appointment. Again, you will only be sent an appointment email if you sign up using the link above. Note, VCU paused the administration of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine based on guidance from health agencies. Pfizer and Moderna vaccines require a second dose. You will receive information about making your second appointment after you receive your first dose.

If you require accommodations or have questions, please do not reply to the “Vaccination Clinics” email; instead, contact vaccine@vcu.edu after you confirm your appointment.

If you have already indicated your interest through this survey, you do not need to complete it again. If you would like to update your response, you can submit a new response.

VCU continues to recommend you receive the vaccine wherever you can, whether that be VCU or your state or local health district. For more information, visit together.vcu.edu/faq/vaccine/.

Have you already received your vaccination?

If you received your COVID-19 vaccination and would like to report it to VCU, you can do so by [completing the interest survey](#). Select the second option:

- I have already received a vaccine from VCU or another source and will submit my vaccine record to the university for verification.
- You will then be prompted to submit a photo or scan of your documentation.

Vaccination and reporting your vaccination to VCU are voluntary and not a condition of enrollment or employment. In addition to guidance from public health experts, VCU relies on this timely information to make decisions that impact university operations and plan vaccination events. Vaccinated VCU community members may also be exempt from surveillance testing and extended quarantine.

If you are in the process of being vaccinated (if you have an appointment or are awaiting a second dose) and wish to report your vaccination at a later date, a link to this reporting form will remain available through your daily health check or myVCU portal.
